

The guitar can be color coded so that enthusiastic students can learn to play different chords with a visual support system. To play a C major chord, one needs to place their fingers over the yellow stickers. To play a G major chord, the fingers are placed over the red stickers. Voila! Eureka! Now you can play hundreds of songs. There are many guitar web sites that offer free samples of chords. You can color code whatever chords you want to play. Just put in a search using the words: guitar chords
